

# Rapid Needs Assessment in Armenia

The rapid needs assessment was conducted by CARE Caucasus and WINNET Goris Development Foundation in Sep 26- Sep 29, 2023, to identify the immediate needs of the displaced population and provide information for CARE and other humanitarian agencies to plan emergency response tailored to the needs and priorities of the conflict-affected population.

## Methodology



118 families surveyed covering 606 individuals



**81%** female respondents

**19%** male respondents

Avg age of respondents = **47.3**


Pregnant women = **3%**

Persons with disabilities = **4%**

## Family Composition




Avg family size = **5.1**

### Intentions



**35%** of the respondents planned to move to another place within one month.

**23%** planned to move to a government hotel.

**9%** planned to move to relatives' or friends' places or a rented house.

# Top Priority Needs

Respondents were asked to choose their three top priority needs from a list



**94%** Accommodation



**77%** Employment



**75%** Cash for Various Purposes



**62%** Hygiene items



**54%** Clothes



**50%** Items for babies



**49%** Transportation, fuel, mobile



**18%** Psychological support



**17%** Legal support or registration

## Food insecurity & Financial Instability

In the last 7 days

**76%**

Often reduce the number of meals per day

**74%**

Often limit intake due to other families members/children to eat

**60%**

did not have sufficient funds to buy items of basic needs (food, hygiene, clothes)

**66%**

Fully agrees that their family did not have enough to eat in the last 3 months

- 18%-no sufficient funds to buy more than one item;
- 5%-sufficient funds for 1 month
- 1%-sufficient funds for 3 months living
- 6%-sufficient funds now

## Safety and dignity Issues affecting respondents



**33%**

reported no affecting issues



**22%**

violation of their rights



**21%**

unable to reach family members (mob. connection)



**14%**

loss of ID documents

While less common, **family separation (6%)** and **harassment or discrimination (4%)** were still reported by some respondents, indicating that these are less frequent but impactful issues affecting a portion of the surveyed population
